eight hundred and eighty.

August one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine
and which said will is herewith annexed and
marked A

That the same annexed will is as I believe
unrevoked and is the true last will of the said

widow Anne Connor sole executrix thereof

which is to come feel it to be my duty to express
my last will and testament in reference
to the disposal of the worldly goods of which
I may be possessed when it shall please
my Heavenly Father to call me from this
world into the next — With this in view —
it is my will that my beloved Wife Anne
shall possess and have all monies goods
chattels and whatever property shall be
lawfully mine at the time of my decease —
including my interest in a Policy of
Life Insurance in the office of the London
and Liverpool and Globe Insurance
Company — and one half share in the profits
and all that pertains to the "Jack Rivulet
Run" South Gipsy Land — the remaining
half to belong to my Son George William Connor
— or in the event of the sale thereof that
she shall have one half of the proceeds
of such sale — And further that the said
monies goods chattels interest in Life Policy
half share of profits or half share of proceeds of
sale of Run as aforesaid shall be used by her for
her benefit and to assist her in the maintenance
of any of our children that may be dependent
upon her for support — And further that
